As Chair, I've spent time liaising with the council and the Kent High Weald Partnership (KHWP) to address maintenance issues brought to our attention.

We have communicated all current concerns to the appropriate teams, and plans are in place to tackle them as we move into autumn, a time that minimises disruption to wildlife. Upcoming actions include several KHWP (Kent High Weald Partnership) workdays to tidy the wetlands, a weed clearance operation in Marnock Lake organised by Tunbridge Wells Borough Council (TWBC), and efforts to tackle invasive species like Himalayan balsam and sallow.
